


Financial Summary

Our fundraising efforts include spring and fall appeals, with the bulk of our fundraising occurring during our month-long March for Meals campaign. March for Meals is a national campaign that brings awareness to senior hunger and isolation, promotes volunteerism, and raises funds for local programs. Our March for Meals campaign kicks off at Beloit Culver's on March 1, and other events during the month include Bowling to Strike Out Hunger, Mushing for Meals 10K Run & 5K Walk/Run, a month-long raffle, and other fundraising events held by local businesses to help support our organization.

Beloit Meals On Wheels provides daily nutritious meals and information to promote dignity and independence to the homebound elderly, ill and disabled.

History

Beginning July 12, 1971, the Beloit Meals On Wheels program initiated its history of service to the homebound elderly, ill and disabled residents of the Greater Beloit area who were unable to prepare meals for themselves. Today, we continue to serve a broad spectrum of clientele, meeting their varied needs - be they on a short-term basis while recuperating from an illness or surgery or long-term as a more permanent means of food support.

Volunteers

Every week, volunteers deliver more than 500 meals across the Greater Beloit area. We could not operate without the help of volunteers who deliver more than just a meal. They donate their time, vehicle, a friendly smile and safety check to those who need it most. It's the connections made that bring meaning into the lives of our seniors that make our program so important.

In July 2016, our membership partner, Meals on Wheels America, along with their partnership with the Ad Council, kicked off the America Let's Do Lunch volunteer recruitment initiative to inspire a new generation of volunteers to meet the rising need.



Every day our volunteers deliver meals, along with friendly visits and safety checks to those who need them most.
